

Lyneham Primary School and Malmesbury C of E Primary School have been officially recognised as dyslexia-friendly schools after verified visits from the BDA.

Wiltshire Council's SEN Service is in the process of supporting 17 primary and secondary schools in achieving the Quality Mark, which is awarded to schools and organisations that can demonstrate their commitment, practice and high quality of education for dyslexic individuals.

The two primary schools awarded proved that their framework is improving their understanding of dyslexia and the literacy difficulties that children with dyslexia can face. They have successfully developed strategies that support the achievement and engagement of dyslexic learners.

Lyneham Primary School and Malmesbury C of E Primary School showed the involvement and engagement of all those who work within the schools. It was decided that their approaches to teaching and learning, monitoring and assessments, differentiation and high-quality practices were of the standard to achieve the Quality Mark.
