ENGLISH

In writing, children will become more independent by sounding out words and using word prompt cards. We will rise to more challenging phonics, weekly spellings patterns and grammar. We will share texts related to our topic.



HISTORY

This unit looks at the similarities and differences between toys today and toys in the past. Could you tell your child about toys and games you or your parents used to play?



MATHS

Children will build upon their knowledge of addition and subtraction and how they link together. We will also learn about place value of numbers of 20 and beyond.

SCIENCE

We will be learning about the different materials that toys are made from and sort them according to their properties. You could ask your child what their toys are made of and sort them into groups.
