Literacy

- Read books to build confidence in word reading, fluency, understanding and enjoyment.
- Continue learning phonics to help with both reading and writing.
- Blend sounds into words so that they can read short words with known letter-sound correspondences.
- Spell words by identifying the sound/s and then writing the sounds with letters

EAD, Expressive arts and design

- Explore, use and refine a variety of artistic effects to express ideas and feelings.
- Create collaboratively, sharing ideas, resources and skills.
- Topic-related art using junk modelling to create a fire engine, and a firefighter using a wide range of media.

Our learning this term includes:

Numeracy

- Say one number for each item in order.
- Begin to recognise amounts without counting (subitise).
- Understand the 1 more than/1 less than relationship between consecutive numbers.
- Link the number symbol (numeral) with its cardinal number value.
- Begin to learn number bonds to 5.
- Finding 6,7,8
- Length, weight and capacity.

Understanding of the world

- Talk about the lives of the people around them and their roles in society.
- Know some similarities and differences between different religious and cultural communities in this country, drawing on experiences and what has been read in class.

Physical development

- Develop a handwriting style that is accurate and efficient.
- Ball skills—roll, stop a rolling ball, throw, bounce, catch, dribble with feet, kick
- Continue to develop scissor skills.

Communication and Language (CL)

- Hold conversation when engaged in back-and-forth exchanges with their teacher and peers.
- Express their ideas and feelings about their experiences using full sentences, including accurate use of past, present and future tenses, and making use of conjunctions with modelling and support from an adult.

Personal, social, emotional development (PSED)

- Set and work towards simple goals, being able to wait for what they want and control their immediate impulses when appropriate.
- Be confident to try new activities and show independence, resilience and perseverance in the face of challenges.
- Form positive attachments to adults and friendships with peers.

Home learning

Home learning is vital in aiding your child to consolidate learning that has taken place in school. Continue to work on your home packs and reading. Remember to make the learning fun and keep it short! Thank you for your continued support and co-operation!
